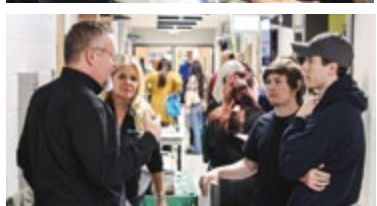
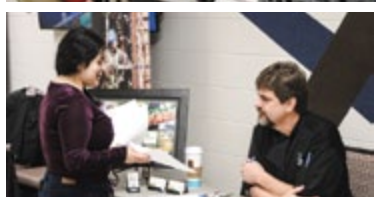


2023 Van Buren Tech Job Fair

Gilroy spent some time with VBT students and was joined by his lead CNC machinist at Titans of CNC, Barry Seltzer. Responding likewise, Advanced Manufacturing instructor Gabe Kooyers shifted his program's focus to the Titans of CNC Academy curriculum. The Titans of CNC Academy program was released in 2016 and over the past seven years Van Buren Tech manufacturing students have earned national recognition for their skills. The Advanced Manufacturing program has also received attention at the national level for its innovative implementation of the Titans of CNC Academy. The CNC EXPERT from Titans of CNC is an online platform which enables students to earn certifications in the Titans of CNC Academy parts, including an online portfolio students can use to network and demonstrate qualifications for employment. VBT students walked away from this visit feeling inspired and ready to enter the industry at a proficient level.

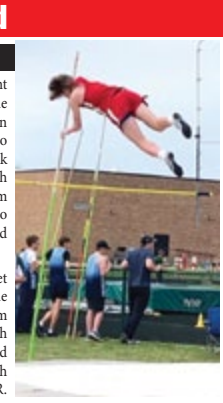

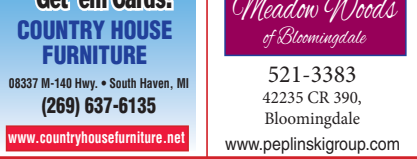


Varsity Girls Soccer

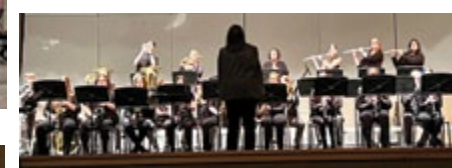
Mr. Bangor Nolan Crandall Takes Second Runner Up At Blossomtime Festival
