2022 Water Quality Report for CITY OF BANGOR

Water Supply Serial Number: 0380

This report covers the drinking water quality for the CITY OF BANGOR for the 2022 calendar year. This information is a snapshot of the quality of the water that we provided to you in 2022. Included are details about where your water comes from, what it contains and how it compares to United States Environmental Protection Agency (U.S. EPA) and state standards.

Your water comes from #3, #7, #8, and #9 groundwater wells, each over 70 to 219 feet deep. The State performed an assessment of our source water to determine the susceptibility or the relative potential of contamination. The susceptibility rating is on a seventiered scale from "very-low" to "very-high" based on geologic sensitivity, well construction, water chemistry and contamination sources. The susceptibility of our source is HIGHLY SUSCEPTIBLE.

There are significant sources of contamination including OLD ABANDON WELLS, OLD FUEL TANKS, AND OLD INDUSTRIAL SITES in our water supply. We are making efforts to protect our sources by SECURING MONIES TO CAP OFF OLD WELLS AND CLEAN UP SITES, AND WE PARTICIPATE IN A WELLHEAD PROTECTION PROGRAM

Contaminants and their presence in water: Drinking water, including bottled water, may reasonably be expected to contain at least small amounts of some contaminants. The presence of contaminants does not necessarily indicate that water poses a health risk. As water travels over the surface of the land or through the ground, it dissolves naturally occurring minerals and, in some cases, radioactive material, and can pick up substances resulting from the presence of animals or from human

Contaminants that may be present in source water include:

- Microbial contaminants, such as viruses and bacteria, may come from sewage treatment plants, septic systems, agricultural livestock operations and wildlife.
- Inorganic contaminants, such as salts and metals, can be naturally occurring or result from urban stormwater runoff, industrial or domestic wastewater discharges, oil and gas production mining or farming.
- Pesticides and herbicides, which may come from a variety of sources such as agriculture and residential uses.
- Radioactive contaminants, which can be naturally occurring or be the result of oil and gar production and mining activities.
- Organic chemical contaminants, synthetic and volatile organic chemicals, which are by-products of industrial processes and petroleur production, and can also come from gas stations.



In order to ensure that tap water is safe to drink, the U.S. EPA prescribes regulations that limit the levels of certain contaminants in water provided by public water systems. Federal Food and Drug Administratio regulations establish limits for contaminants in bottled water which provide the same protection for public

Water Quality Data

The table below lists all the drinking water contaminants that we detected during the 2022 calendar year. The presence of these contaminants in the water does not necessarily indicate that the water poses a health risk. Unless otherwise noted, the data presented in this table is from testing done January 1 through December 31, 2022. Information about lead: If present, elevated levels of lead can cause serious health problems, especially for pregnant women and young children. Lead in drinking water is primarily from materials and components associated with service lines and home plumbing. The City of Bengor is responsible for providing high quality drinking water but cannot control the variety of materials used in plumbing components. When your water has been sitting for several hours, you can minimize the potential for lead exposure by flushing your tap for 30 seconds to 2 minutes before using water for drinking or cooking, if you have a lead service line it is recommended that you run your water for all least 6 minutes to flush water from both your home plumbing and the lead service line. If you are concerned about lead in your water, you may wish to have your water tested. hiorine residuals were taken from two of five sample locations. We collected routine bac on September 7, 2022, and took the required chlorine residuals, recorded and reported to EGLE which met the inking water standards set by the Safe Drinking Water Act. Our staff is making every effort to ensure this oos not happen again.

celforms are bacteria that are naturally present in the environment and are used as an indicator that other, otentially harmful, waterborne pathogens may be present or that a potential pathway exists through which ontamination may enter the drinking water distribution system. We found colforms, indicating the need to look for potential problems in water treatment or distribution. When this occurs, we are required to conduct sment(s) to identify problems and to correct the problems that were found during these assessments.

In September of 2022 we had to complete a Level 1 Assessment Form for EGLE. This form was completed and returned to them. It consists of sample sites, sample collection, wells, treatment, water tank storage, distribution system, operation and maintenance questions. This form can be discussed with me at any time and is attached at the end of the report. Now all personal have been trained and are required to take samples by efecting the area of the sample source, letting the water run for a minimum of 5 minutes, getting a free and rine test, taking the sample, and then recording all the information.

in September 1, 2022 we were out of compliance and returned back into compliance on September 7, 2022. when the routine coliform samples and chlorine disinfectant residuals were collected. See last sheet for more

During the past year we have been required to conduct a Level 1 Asses sent to EGLE on August 31, 2022. The assessment was reviewed by EGLE and cleared with a ecommendation to talk about having the storage tank cleaned and inspected. This was sent back to us on september 14, 2022, and can be reviewed with me in my office.


