WILFLIFE-MINDED GARDENING

As spring blossoms and the last thoughts of winter fade away, flowers become big and showy and colors start to pop. What we do not often think about is how our gar dens can be entryways to invasive plants. Invasive plants are not native to the local area and cause harm to either human health, the economy, or the environment.

Most of the "bigshot" invasive plants that we deal with today were brought over by settlers for their gardens. Many of these plants can still be bought at nurseries today.

Whether for their beautiful blooms or their uses for food and medicine, these plant can harm native wildlife. Despite these uses, it is important to be mindful of how your gardening can impact wildlife. But are you planting these in your garden? Below are some commonly planted invasive plants to avoid and some native ones to plant

Instead of forget-me-nots, plant lupine nstead of wisteria, plant Joe-Pye weed!

Instead of English ivy, plant partridge berry!
Instead of burning bush, plant red chokeberry!

nstead of morning glory, plant Michigan monkey-flower!

Instead of bush honeysuckle, plant summersweet! Instead of black locust, plant quaking aspen!

Instead of buckthorn, plant American hazelnut

For the Bees

While you are out buying flowers for your garden, something to look out for would be a chemical used in plant treatment called neonicotinoids. Made from tobacco, neonicotinoids prolong blooms as flowers are shipped to stores. However, this chemical can be extremely harmful for bees and can cause colony collapse. Flowers that have been treated with this chemical should have that noted on its packaging. If you have bought these flowers, you should cut off the flower heads that have already bloomed Flower heads that have not yet bloomed will not affect the bees, as they pick up the chemical during the pollination process.

COLUMBIA TOWNSHIP TIRE COLLECTION

Columbia Township's Transfer Station is collecting tires until August 20, 2023, at no cost to Columbia Township property owners (no tractor, ex-large or semi tires). The Township is required to obtain 500 tires by August 18, 2023, to receive grant money to reduce the number of tires in the township.

There is no limit to the amount of tires you bring in on normal Transfer Station hours, but the Township is restricted to collecting 900 tires through August 18, 2023, during normal Transfer Stations hours. Once 900 tires are collected the transfer station cannot accept more until August 19th.

The tires must be located in Columbia Township, and the person bringing them must show proof of property or living in the Township.



Girl Scout Project by PPHS Senior -Book Vending Machines Encourage Reading

Congratulations to PPHS Senior Molly McNitt for completing the hours required to submit for her Girl Scouts Gold Award! The Gold Award is earned by creating a sustainable service project and delegating 80 plus hours to the project.

With the goals of promoting the growth of home libraries and creating a fun experience for kids, Molly chose to purchase book vending machines for Paw Paw Early Elementary and Paw Paw Later Elementary.

You may be asking, what are book vending machines, and how do they work? They look like an ordinary vending machine, but instead of getting a snack, you get a book! When students receive tokens from school staff for exemplary behavior, academic success or other positive actions, they receive tokens. Then, the tokens can be directly inserted into the machines in exchange for a book of their choice.

This not only creates positive reinforcement for students' actions, but also encourages them to read more. What's more, by using books as a reward, it contributes to a culture of lifelong learning and continuous academic growth.

To make ends meet, more families are required to spend more time at work and less time at home. Because Paw Paw Early and Later Elementary are classified as low-income, high-risk schools with 48% percent of students receiving free or reduced lunch, many students who struggle with reading may not have the privilege of having literary materials at home, or they may not have a parent at home who can offer them academic support.

According to the 2020-21 Michigan Student Test of Educational Progress (M-STEP), 52.7% of Paw Paw's Later Elementary

students were proficient in English Language Arts, whereas 50.5% were considered proficient in reading on the 2021-2022 M-STEP Assessment. There is clearly a need for more ways to motivate students to read.

These are just a few of the benefits of these machines. Students could also keep the books they receive, which would give them pride of ownership as they build their own

According to Jeremy Davison, Paw Paw Later Elementary Principal, "Through increased accessibility to books, the book vending machines will enhance the learning environment. The Later Elementary has been working hard to change the culture of the elementary school when it comes to reading. This project further supports that mission."

In conclusion, Mr. Davison said, "It will be exciting to see the positive ripple effect of this project! It will not only impact the 925 students currently enrolled between both elementary schools, but will also benefit thousands of students in future classes as well




