I don't have enough fingers, toes or memory space to share how many times in my 30 year career as an educator I have heard, "Must be nice to have summers off." Of course I refuse to respond in a negative fashion, but it does bother me that there is this misconception that teachers use the gift of summertime to be lazy. There is so much material to pour through and plans to get in front of before August. Many teachers have summer jobs or simply focus on their own children. All this brings me to my point. My daughter struggled with some suicidal thoughts earlier this summer. It quickly raged out of control and she needed to spend some time in a hospital. The social worker that worked with her and with our family suggested that we begin focusing not on my daughter's weak areas, or her annoying behaviors, but work to build her "inner wealth." This struck a chord with me not only as a parent but as a teacher, a friend and a human. The idea is to focus on the good things people do. We were encouraged to ask our daughter, "Tell me something great about yourself." Initially she had nothing she could say.

After waiting for her to think a decent amount of time I asked, "Would you like some help thinking of your greatness?" I was able to list several things that she did that had not even resonated with her as kind, loving or great. She spent several hours working on a very detailed coloring page. It required very thin, fine point markers to complete and several areas were super tiny. Once she was finished with the piece, she carefully wrote the names of our neighbors on it and dropped it at their door. Knowing my neighbors as I do, I know that they were thrilled with this gift and likely have it on their refrigerator door. Greatness. Often overlooked, often not acknowledged, yet there it is.

Nobody needs to wait until something bad happens to start working on building others up. How many times are you out running errands or shopping and you see people being unkind to one another? I know that I see it every time I leave the house. Honestly, I see it right on my very own street; people missing the opportunity to extend a hand, give a kind word, or simply offer a smile. I have fallen into the trap of saying nothing, or being snappy instead of looking for greatness. It doesn't mean we are bad people, it just means we try harder next time. Most of the time, the people who are the most unkind, the rudest, the hardest to like, are the people who have no idea they have inner greatness. They have been told nothing but negatives so they believe it. We can be helpful and make a difference by pointing out simple acts of kindness. I encourage the act of looking through new eyes. People who are struggling, who are failing at something like a job, a relationship or with mental stuff already know their failures. They beat themselves up over it all day long. We do not point those struggles out. What we need to share are the great things we see, Dig deep if you have to. Truly wonderful feelings come back to those who share kindness with others. I promise, you will like how you feel.

Let's find that inner greatness

In 2022, our office handled 11, 387 calls. As of the end of June, we are at 5,640 calls. The month of June was very busy with 1,145 calls taken for just our office. At times, we've seen an uptick of larcenies, barns and stor age facilities getting broke in to as well as weekend homes. We honored Dispatcher Kelsey VanDerGalien at the 911 Advisory Board Meeting with a life saving award for a call she handled with a subject that had a heart attack. She talked the wife through CPR until EMS arrived. Due to her input and guidance, it made a difference in saving the subject's

In 2022, our Dispatch Center handled 123,690 calls. That breaks down to a call every 2.7 minutes.


In 2022, our Narcotic Division had 296 Felony Cases.

In 2022, our Corrections Staff booked in just shy of 4,700 people. As of July 10th, we are already at 2,395. With our inmate population (we are a 213 bed facility), roughly 40 percent don't live in our county.

In 2022, we had 3.926 traffic stops.

We will be sending 3 cadets to the fall police academy which will be funded through a state grant.

A reminder to keep everything locked up, and if you see anything suspicious, call our office. We take several calls a year for unlocked vehicles being gone through, as well as sheds, barns, etc.
