



Invasive Species Treatment in County Rights of Wav




The Van Buren Conservation District (VBCD) has partnered with the Van Buren County Road Commission (VBCRC) to control invasive plants that are damaging to our infrastructure and natural resources. Invasive plants are not native to our area and cause harm to our health, environment, and economy. For the third year in a row, this program will treat invasive plants, like Phragmites and Japanese knotweed, along county road rights

The VBCD works with invasive species specialists of the SWxSW Corner CISMA to determine responsible and effective treatment. As southwest Michigan's go-to source for invasive species management and education, the CISMA has experience in managing plants that are difficult to treat, such as Phragmites and Japanese knotweed. These plants are prioritized due to their damaging impact on our roads, waterways, and infrastructure. Since 2021, VBCD staff have mapped and treated these invasive plants throughout all the county's roads.

Throughout August and up to the first hard frost of the season, VBCD staff will spray herbicide of known locations within thirty-three feet of the county road centerline. A low but effective concentration of herbicide is sprayed using a backpack sprayer. The VBCD values our soil, water, and wildlife. This method ensures that the target plants are treated without unnecessary damage to our natural resources.

Have you seen invasive Phragmites or Japanese knotweed on the side of a county road? Report it to us! Use Midwest Invasive Species Information Network (MISN) to report the size, location, and photos of the plant, and that site will be added to

our treatment map. To report invasive species using MISIN, download the MISIN app on your phone or go to www.misin.msu.edu. The SWxSW Corner CISMA is here to help Berriern, Cass, and Van Buren County residents with invasive species educa-
