

was founded to promote the achievement of Black Americans and others of African descent. In 1926, a more formal holiday was established by Dr. Carter G. Woodson with a national Negro History Week, which evolved into today's Black History Month. February was chosen because it coordinates with the birthdays of Abraham Lincoln and Frederick Douglass - two individuals who were essential to the fight for equal rights for Black people.

Black History Month is loaded with oppor-tunities to learn more about influential Black individuals. Local libraries, television channels and schools often focus on such individuals throughout the month of February, providing ample chances for individuals from all walks of life to learn more about people and events that have shaped the nation.

• Watch documentaries. During Black History Month, many networks feature documentaries on influential figures who made their marks in the Black community and beyond. Streaming services also may have documen-taries or special interview series available that highlight certain Black figures. • Visit a cultural center. Museums and other

cultural or community centers emphasize Black history in February. Even in smaller towns one may be able to attend speeches or readings at local libraries. Watch movies. Curate a collection of films that were directed by Black directors or feature

Black history. • Read MLK Jr's famous letter. People car revisit the words of Martin Luther King, Jr. by reading his "Letter From Birmingham Jail." The letter is considered vital for anyone hoping to understand the Civil Rights movement in the United States.



Our office has seen a high amount of Domestic Violence calls over the past few weeks. It's common for this to happen when bad weather hits and people are confined for long periods of time with each other

. We had a Deputy doing traffic on 194hwy from a maior crash when a semi slid by him out of control, narrowly missing him. Fortunately, by God's Grace, he was not seriously injured or killed. It's just another grim reminder on how Law Enforcement. Fire Fighters and First Responders put their lives on the line everyday to keep our community safe and they could lose their lives in a second by events out of their control.

Once again, a marijuana dispensary was broken into. This dispensary was in Paw Paw Township. The four suspects stole approximately \$30,000 worth of product. The vehicle used was stolen out of Calhoun County. This is a trend we've seen over and over with suspects coming into our county in the middle of the night to break into dispensaries. To date, everyone we've been able to develop suspects on are not from our county. Uniform Response handled a multiple vehicle traffic crash on 194hwy in Antwerp Township. It involved 3 semis and a minivan. The highway had to be shut down for about 4 hours to clean the crash scene up. One person was injured in the minivan and transported to the hospital with non-life-threatening injuries.

Our Animal Control Deputy assisted MSP with an Animal Cruelty Complaint in Bangor Township. One horse was deceased on scene and the other one was in very poor condition. The horse was removed from the scene so it could get the required care it needed. Uniform Response took a Domestic violence call in Porter Township. The suspect was charged with Assault with Intent to do Great Bodily Harm less than Murder or by Strangulation as well as Aggravated Assault.

Uniform Besponse was dispatched to a suspicious vehicle at a residence in which the owner lives out of state. The Deputy made contact with a subject inside of the residence It was immediately found that the residence was broke into and the vehicle was stolen out of Kalamazoo The suspect was lodged for Possession of the Stolen Vehicle(IIDAA) and Breaking and Entering into a Residence.

Uniform Response handled a call in Pine Grove Township involving a stolen pickup truck out of Shelbyville. Kalamazoo County had a pursuit with it earlier, after the pursuit, it ended up in our county, and was called in on fire. It appears that the suspect was picked up by another vehicle.

Our Narcotic Unit and Canine Unit did compliance checks with Parole Agents at the KPEP Motel in Paw Paw Township in the late evening hours. Parolees were found with Meth, Psychedelic Mushrooms, Warrants for Their Arrest, and Possession of Ammunition. A subject there visiting also had a warrant for their arrest. In all, 7 people were transported and lodged at our facility for the charges listed.

Detectives went to a residence in Cass County along with the Cass County Sheriff's Office and arrested 3 subjects on warrants out of our office for Larceny over \$1,000, Conspiracy to Commit a Crime, and Larceny from a Motor Vehicle. All 3 subjects were located and arrested on the Felony Warrants. They were transported and lodged at our facility. It stemmed from a complaint in Hartford Township last month that our office took

• Application Procedure. All applicants seeking permis-sion to engage in mining under this ordinance shall apply ently pursue both the issuance of a Special Us for and dil Permit and a license.

• Special Land Use Requirement and Standard. Mineral extraction in the Township may be conducted only based on issuing a Special Use Permit unless excepted under Section 3. • License Requirement and Provisional Request for a Special Use Permit. No person shall engage in the busi-ness of mineral extraction from any property in the Town ship without obtaining a mining and mineral extraction license issued by the Township based on the provisions of this Ordinance. No mining and mineral extraction license shall be issued unless an applicant secures a Special Use Permit for mineral extraction.

new biography by historian Keisha N. Blain released in late 2021, Fannie Lou Hamer rose to prominence during the Civil Rights Movement in the 1960s in the United States. Born to sharecropper parents in Sunflower County, Mississippi, in 1919, Hamer became an activist in 1962, ultimately providing a powerful voice to a widely underrepresented segment of the African American population fighting for civil rights in the 1960s. <u>Viola Davis Desmond:</u> Born in Halifax, Nova Scotia, in 1914, Viola Davis Desmond took a stand for African Canadians in 1946 when she refused to sit in the balconv at the Roseland Theatre in New Glasgow, a section designated for Blacks. Desmond was forcibly removed and arrested and ultimately fined and sentenced to 30 days in

events during the civil rights era in the United States, and Bayard Rustin was one of the event's principle organizers. Rustin who was candid about his sexuality as a gay man in private, often worked behind th scenes during the Civil Rights Movement which occurred during a period when ho-mosexuality was still criminalized. Rustin later became a public advocate for gay rights in the 1980s. <u>Elijah McCoy:</u> The son of former slave

who had escaped enslavement in Kentucky via the Underground Railroad, Elijah Mc Cov was born in Colchester, Ontario, in 1844.
