### PROPOSAL 2 IMPACT TO HOMEOWNERS

Using the average home value in our community of \$90,000, this increase would equate to approximately \$7.50 per month for the average homeowner.

**GENEVA TOWNSHIP SET-BACK ORDINANCE #15 AMENDMENT #3 - March 12, 2024 -for publication**

An Amendment to Geneva Township Set-back Ordinance #15 so as to provide standards for the granting or denial of a variance and so as to make violation thereof a municipal civil infraction, punishable by a fine and orders requiring compliance therewith.

**GENEVA TOWNSHIP, VAN BUREN COUNTY, MICHIGAN ORDAINS:**

**SECTION 1: SET BACK ORDINANCE** A. The minimum front yard setback for all principal buildings and accessory buildings and structures shall be no less than fifty (50) feet measured from all public & private road right-of-way lines. The setback is measured from the nearest point of the foundation of all principal and accessory building and structures located upon a lot or parcel. B. The minimum side yard setback for all principal buildings and structures shall be no less than twenty (20) feet and a minimum total of forty (40) feet for both side yards between the side lot or parcel line. The setback is measured from the nearest point of the foundation of all principal and accessory building and structures located upon a lot or parcel. The minimum side yard setback from property lines for accessory buildings and structures shall be no less than ten (10) feet. C. The minimum rear yard setback for all principal buildings and structures shall be no less than fifty (50) feet between the rear lot or parcel line. The setback is measured from the nearest point of the foundation of all principal and accessory building and structures located upon a lot or parcel. The minimum rear yard setback from property lines for accessory buildings and structures shall be no less than ten (10) feet. **SECTION 2: Variance Authority and Procedure** A. Variance Authority and Standards The Township Board may grant variances/waivers from the requirements of this Ordinance when the Township Board determines that the following standards are satisfied in the circumstances of each specified case: 1. Strict compliance with the ordinance requirement would result in a practical difficulty or unnecessary hardship because of the particular physical surroundings, shape or topographical conditions of the parcel of property involved, as distinguished from a mere inconvenience or economic hardship. 2. The variance/waiver may be granted without detriment to the public safety, health, or general welfare, or damage to other property. 3. The ordinance requirement at issue is not applicable to the specific situation presented; or, the purpose is applicable but may be served even if a variance is granted. 4. The conditions upon which the request for variance is based are unique to the subject property. 5. Approval of a variance/waiver will not in any manner result in a violation of any other ordinance, or any other requirement of law. 6. The conditions providing support for the variance/waiver were not created by the applicant or the applicant's predecessors in title. B. Procedure. A written request for a variance must be submitted to the Township (on a form approved by the Township Board) together with an application fee in the amount that shall be set by the Township Board via resolution and which amount may be changed from time to time by the Township Board via resolution. Once a variance request has been received, the Township shall set the request to be heard at a regular meeting of the Township Board and shall notify the applicant of the date and time of the same. Furthermore, the Township shall notify via regular U.S. Mail all adjoining property owners according to the tax rolls of the date and time of the hearing on the variance request no less than seven (7) calendar days prior to the date of hearing. Applicant need not be present at meeting to have variance request considered. **SECTION 3: Violations and Sanctions** Violation of any of the provisions of this Ordinance or failure to comply with any of its requirements shall be deemed a municipal civil infraction as defined by Michigan statute and shall be punishable by a civil fine of not less than \$200.00, nor more than \$500.00 along with costs which may include all expenses, direct and indirect, to which the township has been put in connection with the municipal civil infraction. A violator of this Ordinance shall also be subject to such additional sanctions and judicial orders as are authorized under Michigan law. Each day that a violation of this Ordinance continues to exist shall constitute a separate violation of this Ordinance. Nothing herein shall prevent the Township board from taking such additional lawful action as it is necessary to restrain or prevent any violation of this ordinance. **SECTION 4: REPEAL** Conflict of Ordinances: All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are repealed. **SECTION 5: SEVERABILITY** This Ordinance and its various parts are hereby declared to be severable. If any portion of this Ordinance is declared to be invalid such declaration shall not affect the validity of the remainder of the Ordinance. **SECTION 6: EFFECTIVE DATE** This Ordinance Amendment #3 shall take effect as required by law.

**FARMERS ARE ASKED TO KEEP RIGHT-OF-WAY CROP FREE**  
"We Mow - So Don't Sow!"  
THE ROAD COMMISSION WANTS YOU TO KNOW...  
With spring quickly approaching, area farmers are anxiously awaiting another planting season. But before spring tillage and planting gets underway, the Van Buren County Road Commission wants to remind farmers that crops must be a minimum of 14' from the road's edge, or behind the "back slope" of an existing ditch. Any crops planted in the right-of-way are there at the farmers' risk and no compensation for loss of crops in the right-of-way will be considered pursuant to Road Commission Policy 2022-02.

Because the Road Commission maintains the right-of-way by performing mowing cycles to keep roadsides and intersections clear and suitable for travel, farmers should be aware that any crops planted within the right-of-way will be mowed. The Road Commission also performs roadside chemical vegetation management in the late summer to control brush and woody vegetation within the road right-of-way. The road right-of-way is specifically reserved for the placement of road signs, and public utilities. The road right-of-way is typically a width of 66 feet (33 feet on either side of the centerline of the road).

SECTION 1. Title and Applicable Season  
"This ordinance shall be known and cited as the Bangor Tall Grass and Weed Ordinance and shall be applicable and in full force and effect from April 1st through October 31st of each year."  
SECTION 5. Duty to Cut Grass  
"The owner and/or occupants of land to which this ordinance applies shall not allow grass or weeds to grow over six inches (6") in height throughout the growing season, including grass and weeds in the right-of-way, and it shall be the duty of all owners and/or occupants of land located in Bangor City either to cut or otherwise destroy by lawful means all tall grass and weeds, as defined in this ordinance, which are growing upon said property, before they reach a seed-bearing stage, and to prevent said weeds from perpetuating themselves and from becoming a detriment to public health. On an undeveloped lot, tall grass and weeds must be cut back at a distance of at least thirty feet from the roadway so as to allow a clear line of site for any person using a sidewalk or roadway."

# A Timeline of Milestones in U.S. Women's History

1848 - The first women's rights convention, the Seneca Falls Convention, is held in New York, where 300 women and men sign the Declaration of Sentiments in a plea to end discrimination against women.

1848 - The Married Woman's Property Act is passed in New York, enabling married women to conduct business on their own, file lawsuits on their own behalf, collect rents and receive inheritances. The Act is used as a model for other states, all of which pass their own versions by 1900.

1860 - The Act Concerning the Rights and Liabilities of Husband and Wife is passed in New York, paving the way for other states. It acknowledges "mothers as joint guardians of their children," granting married women the same legal authority over their own sons and daughters as fathers.

1869 - Wyoming, a territory at the time, becomes the first state to grant women the right to vote in all elections.

1869 - Susan B. Anthony and Elizabeth Cady Stanton form the National Woman Suffrage Association (NWSA).

1872 - Victoria Claffin Woodhull becomes the first female U.S. presidential candidate.

1872 - Equal pay for equal work under the law is guaranteed to federal, but not private sector, employees.

1919 - The First Woman's Bank of Tennessee opens as the first bank to be directed, managed and staffed entirely by women. The bank welcomes deposits from men and women, although its shareholders are male.

1919 - Congress passes the 19th Amendment, granting women the right to vote.

1920 - The 19th Amendment is ratified by 36 states and becomes law, ensuring that the right to vote cannot be denied on the basis of sex.

1938 - The Fair Labor Standards Act establishes a

federal minimum wage to eliminate pay differences between men and women for hourly jobs.

1948 - The Women's Armed Services Integration Act allows women to serve as full, permanent members of all of the branches of the U.S. military.

1963 - The Equal Pay Act is passed, protecting all workers against discrimination in pay rates.

1974 - The Equal Credit Opportunity Act is passed, prohibiting credit discrimination on the basis of race, color, religion, national origin, sex, marital status, age or receipt of public assistance. Prior to its passage, banks required a male cosigner on credit applications from single, widowed or divorced women, regardless of income.

1974 - The Fair Housing Act is amended to prohibit housing discrimination on the basis of sex.

1978 - The Pregnancy Discrimination Act is passed, making it illegal for employers to dismiss women from their jobs for becoming pregnant.

1981 - Sandra Day O'Connor becomes the first woman appointed to serve on the U.S. Supreme Court.

1993 - The Family and Medical Leave Act becomes law.

1994 - The Gender Equity in Education Act is passed to train teachers in gender equity, promote math and science learning by girls, counsel pregnant teens and prevent sexual harassment.

1994 - The Violence Against Women Act funds services, resources and rights for rape and domestic violence victims.

2007 - Nancy Pelosi becomes the first female Speaker of the United States House of Representatives.

2016 - The Department of Defense opens all military combat positions to women for the first time.



## SHERIFF'S CORNER

### VAN BUREN COUNTY SHERIFF DANIEL E. ABBOTT

Uniform Response took a Stolen Vehicle Complaint in Waverly Township. The victim does have a suspect and the vehicle is believed to be in Cass County. The suspect does go back and forth between counties. The vehicle is a silver 2006 Dodge Durango Michigan plate EPN2491. If you see this vehicle you are asked to call our office immediately. The vehicle is currently entered in SOS/LEIN as stolen.

Uniform Response took a larceny of scrap metal/items complaint in Hartford Township. The witness was able to get a plate and vehicle description along with a picture of the item leaving. Deputies were able to develop two suspects, one male one female from the complaint. Deputies are currently looking for the suspects to conduct an interview and recover what was taken. After the investigation is complete, the report will be sent to the Prosecutors Office for a warrant.

Uniform Response took a single vehicle crash in Decatur Township. The driver went into a curve too fast, went off the roadway, and hit a utility pole. The crash did knock out the power in that area for a while. The Lawton resident was lodged for Operating Under the Influence of Alcohol.

Uniform Response located a missing 17-year-old female from Wyoming, Michigan in Alma Township. Deputies worked with Wyoming PD to get the female back to her family. The suspect advised he met her online and she said she was 18 years old. Once the investigation is complete, if the chats show what the suspect alleges, it'll be closed out. If the investigation shows she was solicited and the suspect knew she was underage, the report will go to the Prosecutor's Office for a warrant.

Uniform Response responded to a house fire to assist the Fire Department in Keeler Township. It was found that they were burning items in a burn barrel close to the residence, ambers blew out and a fire started. Nothing appears suspicious currently. This is just a grim reminder not to burn close to a residence, when it's windy, very dry out, etc.

Dispatch received a call about a missing 3-year-old in Geneva Township. The caller advised the child has been gone for approximately 1/2 hour. A South Haven PD Officer and I were close to the residence when the call came out and responded quickly. We were able to secure the scene overall and protect for contamination for the 2 canines I had coming. I did call for one of ours that was off duty while enroute being he lived close and has had 4 recoveries of missing children just like this call. I also requested SHEAS drone, Great Lakes Drone, and SHEAS Ambulance. We were able to locate the child in good condition other than a dirty diaper and some scratches. It was a great team effort by everyone involved with a positive outcome.

Uniform Response handled a shooting complaint in Pine Grove Township. A subject was in his yard when a vehicle went by with two known suspects in it started shooting his direction as well as towards his house. Evidence was collected at the scene and the two suspects in question were located at a residence in the Village of Paw Paw. After interviews were done, the two male subjects were lodged for the incident.

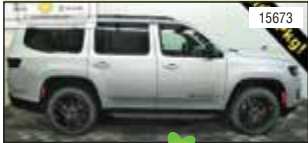
