the information out to the media asking for help. Within 24 hours, a citizen contacted our office with information on a location. The citizen advised they believe the Portable Sawmill in the news was the one at a residence. A Deputy went to the location, and indeed it was the one. Detec tives responded at that time to assist as well. While the investigation was going on, the suspect showed up. After the investigation was completed, the Hartford Resident was lodged for the incident on two felonies, Receiving and Concealing as well as Larceny. The same subject has pending charges from an incident within the last week for other Larceny charges in the Hartforn Area. The Sawmill was transported back to the victim by Detectives. A huge thank you to th citizen that called.

Uniform Response handled a Traffic Crash in Lawrence Township with a single motor vehicle The Deputy did arrest the driver for Operating Under the Influence of Alcohol/Drugs. Noone was hurt from the crash.

Uniform Response had a pursuit of a Stolen Vehicle from Barry County. Allegan County Sheriff's Office started the pursuit in their county as the 4 individuals were found Breaking i Vehicles. Allegan County lost sight of the vehicle coming into our county north of Blooming dale. Deputies did find the vehicle right after that driving through Gobles and the vehicle flec again. The vehicle lost control at an intersection in Waverly Township, hitting a utility pole. Al 4 individuals were placed in custody. The 4 Juveniles were all from Kalamazoo and TOT(Turner over to) Allegan County Sheriff's Office due to the pursuit being their original. It should be noted that the Driver had a Juvenile Warrant for his arrest and the other occupants were known t Kalamazoo due to their history.

Uniform Response was dispatched to an Assault Complaint in Porter Township. The investi gation showed that the victim woke up to her roommate in her room and the suspect punched her several times. The victim got away to call 911. After doing so, the suspect got a kitchen knife and held it to the victim's face, cutting her with it. The victims dog intervened, biting the suspect during the altercation and possibly saved her life by doing so. The suspect was lodged for Resisting and Obstructing and Assault with Intent to Murder. Multiple Detectives from our Office attended a 32-hour training in Lansing with several Spe-

cialists putting it on. Detectives were updated and learned new things about investigation resources, cell phone and digital evidence collection and analysis, social media, fraud, missing persons, and death investigations. Other topics were covered besides the ones listed. We continue to send our office to trainings to not only keep up with things changing, but to keep folks with the most knowledgeable information available.

Uniform Response took a Larceny of a Trail Camera in Paw Paw Township. The victim pu the picture of the suspect out on social media, and we put it out to Law Enforcement and Cor rections Staff. The Trail Camera sent the picture of the suspect to the victim as he was stealing it. Citizens were able to ID the suspect as was Local PD. The Deputy made contact with the suspect, obtained a search warrant for a storage facility, and recovered the Trail Camera. The Camera was returned to the victim and charges are pending on the local Paw Paw Resident.

# Timeline of Milestones in U.S. Women's History

1848 - The first women's rights convention, the Seneca Falls Convention, is held in New York, where 300 women and men sign the Declaration of Sentiments in a plea to end discrimination against women.

1848 - The Married Woman's Property Act is passed in New York, enabling married women to conduct business on their own file lawsuits on their own behalf collect rents and receive inheritances. The Act is used as a model for other states, all of which pass their own versions by 1900.

1860 - The Act Concerning the Rights and Liabilities of Husband and Wife is passed in New York, paving the way for other states. It acknowledges "mothers as joint guardians of their children," granting married women the same legal authority over their own sons and daughters

1869 - Wyoming, a territory at the time, becomes the first housing discrimination on the basis of sex. state to grant women the right to vote in all elections.

1869 - Susan B. Anthony and Elizabeth Cady Stanton form the National Woman Suffrage Association (NWSA).

1872 - Victoria Claflin Woodhull becomes the first female U.S. presidential candidate.

1872 - Equal pay for equal work under the law is guaranteed to federal, but not private sector, employees.

1919 - The First Woman's Bank of Tennessee opens as the first bank to be directed, managed and staffed entirely prevent sexual harassment. by women. The bank welcomes deposits from men and women, although its shareholders are male.

1919 - Congress passes the 19th Amendment, granting women the right to vote.

1920 - The 19th Amendment is ratified by 36 states and becomes law, ensuring that the right to vote cannot be denied on the basis of sex.

1938 - The Fair Labor Standards Act establishes a

federal minimum wage to eliminate pay differences between men and women for hourly jobs.

1948 - The Women's Armed Services Integration Act allows women to serve as full, permanent members of all of the branches of the U.S. military.

1963 - The Equal Pay Act is passed, protecting all workers against discrimination in pay rates.

1974 - The Equal Credit Opportunity Act is passed, prohibiting credit discrimination on the basis of race, color, religion, national origin, sex, marital status, age or receipt of public assistance. Prior to its passage, banks required a male cosigner on credit applications from single, widowed or divorced women, regardless of income

1974 - The Fair Housing Act is amended to prohibit

1978 - The Pregnancy Discrimination Act is passed. making it illegal for employers to dismiss women from their jobs for becoming pregnant.

1981 - Sandra Day O'Connor becomes the first woman appointed to serve on the U.S. Supreme Court.


1993 - The Family and Medical Leave Act becomes law.

1994 - The Gender Equity in Education Act is passed to train teachers in gender equity, promote math and science learning by girls, counsel pregnant teens and

1994 - The Violence Against Women Act funds services, resources and rights for rape and domestic violence victims

2007 - Nancy Pelosi becomes the first female Speaker of the United States House of Representatives.

2016 - The Department of Defense opens all military combat positions to women for the first time.



Learn how to spot scams, identify red flags, and report suspicious activity.

#### 1. Four Basic Signs of a Scam

Recognizing the signs of a scam gives you the power to ignore criminals and report the scam. Scams come in many varieties, but they all work the same way:

- 1. Scammers pretend to be from an agency or organization you know to gain your trust.
- 2. Scammers say there is a **problem** or a prize.
- 3. Scammers pressure you to act immediately.
- 4. Scammers tell you to pay in a specific way.

#### 2. Known Tactics Scammers Use

Scammers frequently change their approach with new tactics and messages to trick people. We encourage you to stay up to date on the latest news and advisories by following SSA OIG on LinkedIn, Twitter, and Facebook or subscribing to receive email alerts. These are red flags; you can trust that Social Security will never

- Threaten you with arrest or legal action because you don't agree to pay money immediately.
- Suspend your Social Security number.
- Claim to need personal information or payment to activate a cost-of-living adjustment (COLA) or other benefit increase.
- **Pressure** you to take immediate action, including sharing personal information.
- Ask you to pay with gift cards, prepaid debit cards, wire transfers, cryptocurrency, or by mailing cash.
- Threaten to seize your bank account.
- Offer to move your money to a "protected" bank account.
- Demand secrecy. Be skeptical and look for red flags. If you receive a suspicious call, text message, email, letter, or message on social media, the caller or sender may not be who they say you, ever. they are. Scammers have also been known to:
- Use legitimate names of Office of Inspector General or Social Security Administration employees.
- "Spoof" official government phone numbers, or even numbers for local police departments
- Send official-looking documents by U.S. mail or attachments through email, text, or social media message.

It is illegal to reproduce federal employee credentials and federal law enforcement badges. Federal law enforcement will never send photographs of credentials or badges to demand any kind of payment, and neither will federal government employees. Report the scam.

#### 3. How to Avoid a Scam

Protect yourself, friends, and family - If you receive a suspicious call, text, email, social media message, or letter from someone claiming to be from Social Security:

- 1. Remain calm. If you receive a communication that causes a strong emotional response, take a deep breath. Talk to someone you trust.
- 2. Hang up or ignore the message. Do not click on links or attachments.
- 3. Protect your money. Scammers will insist that you pay with a gift card, prepaid debit card, cryptocurrency, wire transfer, money transfer, or by mailing cash. Scammers use these forms of payment because they are hard to trace.
- 4. Protect your personal information. Be cautious of any contact claiming to be from a government agency or law enforcement telling you about a problem you don't recognize, even if the caller has some of your personal information
- 5. Spread the word to protect your community from scammers.
- 6. Report the scam to the Office of the Inspector General at oig.ssa.gov/report.

#### 4. How to Report

When you report a scam, you are providing us with powerful data that we use to inform others, identify trends, refine strategies, and take legal action against the criminals behind these scam activities.

## **Phone Scam Awareness**

### **Social Security Phone Scammers May:**

 Promise to increase your benefits or resolve identity theft if you pay a fee. Demand payment with retail gift cards, wire transfers, internet currency, or by mailing cash. Try to convince you by using spoofed caller ID numbers or officials' real names, or by emailing fake documents.

#### **DO NOT BELIEVE THEM!**

If you owe money to Social Security, the agency will mail you a letter with payment options and appeal rights. Social Security does not suspend Social Security numbers or demand secrecy from


